Seasonality – buying local produce in season ensures freshness.

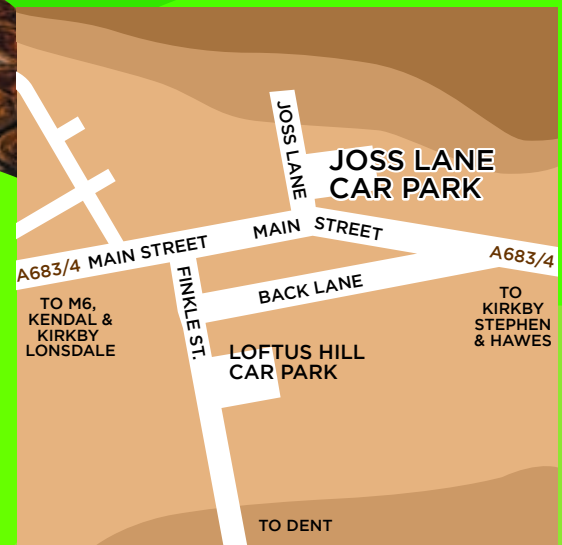


Market Office & Bookings
